ON-GOING LECTURER POOL -

The American Studies Department at the University of California, Santa Cruz, is developing an on-going pool of qualified temporary instructors to teach courses which will supplement the core curriculum in the department. We invite applicants interested in teaching one or more interdisciplinary undergraduate American Studies courses in the area listed below. A candidate selected to the American Studies/Ethnic Studies Lecturer Pool may be approached by another campus unit to teach a course requiring the same minimum qualifications in an appropriate subject area.

RANK: Lecturer

SALARY: \$4,696.50– \$5,142 per course, commensurate with qualifications and experience.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D. (preferred), M.A. or the equivalent in relevant field, with university teaching experience in the appropriate subject area.

EFFECTIVE: As openings occur starting Spring Quarter 2002, contingent upon availability of funding.

Most of the courses needed by the Department are lecture courses, so applicants should speak to their qualifications as lecturers. We particularly invite applicants qualified to teach any of the following courses:

- Introductory courses focusing on the social and cultural diversity of the United States by means of both historical and contemporary materials.
- Introductory and advanced courses in comparative ethnic and diaspora studies, African American, Asian American, Chicano/Latino, and Native American studies.
- Introductory and advanced courses emphasizing interdisciplinary theory and methods, in the areas of oral history, ethnography, gender and sexuality studies, political economy, technology, and California/Pacific Rim studies.
- Introductory and advanced courses focused on cultural representations and practice including music, literature, film, mass media, and popular culture.
