COLLEGE TEN FROSH SEMINAR

Lecturer Ongoing Pool

[College Ten](#) at the University of California, Santa Cruz, is recruiting an ongoing pool of qualified temporary instructors to teach sections of the College Ten Frosh Seminar, entitled "Social Justice and Community: A Writing and Discussion Seminar." The course addresses topics such as discrimination, poverty, and human rights. All College Ten frosh are required to enroll in the class. It is taught in seminars of 20-25 students that meet three times per week. There is a particular emphasis on developing students' writing skills; students are required to write and to revise several papers. Instructors also meet with students individually, provide feedback on students' writing, prepare narrative evaluations and letter grade assessments of students' performance, and carry out other normal instructional duties. Also, there are two weekly faculty meetings. Please note that all instructors use the same syllabus with the same reading and writing assignments.

Rank: Lecturer

Salary: \$4,791 - \$5,319 per section

Minimum Qualifications: Master's degree or equivalent in a discipline relevant to social justice such as cultural studies, economics, history, political science, social psychology, or sociology. A Ph.D. is preferred but not required. Candidates should have successful past experience in university-level teaching either as an instructor or a graduate student teaching assistant. Instructor must be qualified to work with students on basic writing skills.

Position Available: Instructors are expected to teach two sections of the course. Beginning Fall Quarter 2006, contingent upon availability of funding. Appointments are limited to only the fall quarter. (No summer, winter, or spring courses are available.)

Apply to: Candidates accepted to previous pools must reapply if they wish to be considered as a candidate and must submit letters of recommendation as explained below.

Please submit a letter of application, curriculum vitae, three letters of recommendation (sent directly from your letter writers), and teaching evaluations (if available).
