The Arboretum hopes to offer a job training experience in horticulture, arboretum work, stewardship, land management, etc. A lot of the content of the internship comes down to gardening work with soil and plants.



About the program

The Arboretum was founded in 1964 under Chancellor McHenry. The site was chosen for its great geological and topological diversity as well as its coastal exposure and access to a reservoir. It began with a focus on a trees and expanded to include all sorts of Mediterranean, Australian, and Californian plants. All of the plants are chosen because they grow well in California's climate to emphasize sustainability. The Arboretum is run by a very small staff under campus funding using intern and volunteers alike to keep everything working.
