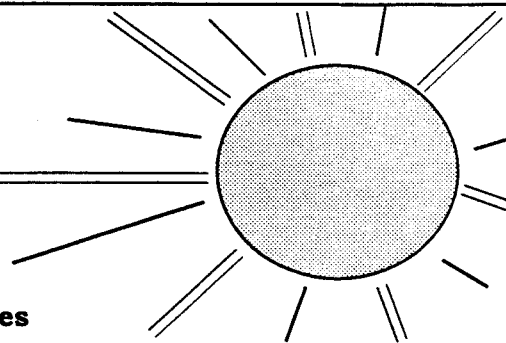

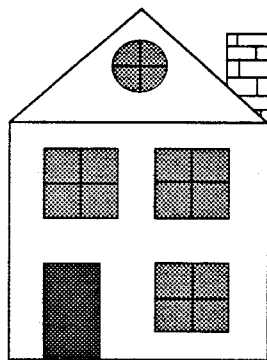

## ¿Qué esta de nuevo en Crown?

María del Carmen Morris, is the Director of Casa Crown. She is a Spanish Lecturer from Buenos Aires, Argentina who was raised in California.



Casa Crown, located in Galileo, Crown College, is a new living and learning project to promote Spanish language speaking and learning through a variety of academic, social, and cultural activities designed to build awareness of current issues in Latin America and in the local community. Two 2-unit courses, are offered through Casa Crown: Crown 50A and B.

Spanish conversation are open to all students--the first based on current events in Latin America and in the community, featuring on and off campus speakers, while 50B is based on volunteer service in the community in the areas of education, health, legal services and women and family issues. Also with guest speakers from the community. Apart from the range of social and cultural activities, Casa Crown's resources, housed in the preceptor's apartment in Galileo, include:

- \*weekly *tertulias* (informal conversation in Spanish) Tues., 7-8:30p.m.

- \*tutoring of Spanish Speakers (projected expansion into writing, possibly math and science); meeting space downstairs for up to 25 people.

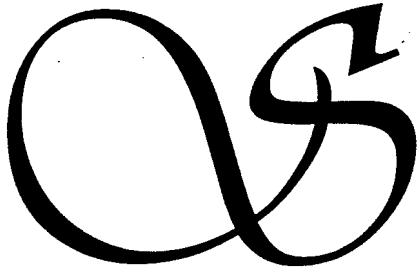
- \*occasional cooking lessons.

The winter quarter includes the showing of two short Mexican contemporary films, a documentary and video conference on the Zapatista movement and a Brazilian Carnival movie and dance.

The *Unión* (named by students present at the second meeting) has met three times. Members have established the following goals and objectives: 1) information sharing about group events and activities; 2) coordinate calendar events and promote collaboration among groups; 3) promote support for each others events and activities; 4) facilitate recruitment, retention and pipeline to graduate school and other post graduate options; 5) alert student to resources on the campus; and 6) inform students about community service and internship opportunities.
